GENERAL STUDIES

The 60-credit associate-level degree in General Studies is intended to help students acquire general fundamental skills and knowledge needed to succeed in college and society.

Requirements for this degree include successfully completing:

- All general education requirements of the university (35 credits)
- Elective courses (25 credits)

While the associate-level General Studies degree may be a reasonable option for those wishing to complete requirements necessary to transfer to another university, it may also be used as an introductory step for students still undecided about which major may be a good fit. To find a better sense of belonging and academic progress, “undecided” students are encouraged to investigate other major options as soon as possible in their academic career. Those who are undecided because of a variety of interests or career and life goals that may require more than one specific emphasis are invited to consider a degree program in Interdisciplinary Studies at BYU–Idaho.
