INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

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The Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies (IDS) degree is a customizable degree designed for students who have many interests, specific career plans, or other significant life goals which may require skills and integration of ideas that cross the boundaries of standard degree offerings.

Requirements for the IDS degree include completing:

- A reduced general education requirement (24 credits)
- A small core of classes in the innovative skills of interdisciplinarity (7-8 credits)
- A disciplinary concentration from one of the university departments (27-33 credits)
- An interdisciplinary skills cluster Data Analysis & Computing, Communication & Design, or Leadership & Management (12 credits)
- Another complimenting area of study such as a minor, certificate, or cluster (12-20 credits)
- Elective courses necessary to bring the total to 120 credits.
